



The museum runs almost entirely on volunteers, and we are always looking to recruit more people to join our team.

The main role for volunteers is to welcome our visitors. This involves taking payments, answering questions and selling items in the gift shop. There are always two people in the museum during opening hours.

We have an electronic till and a card payment machine.

There are acrylic screens in place at both reception desks. Face masks and hand sanitiser are available for our visitors, staff and volunteers to use.

There is a comprehensive 'Volunteers Handbook' that contains detailed information on everything necessary to work as a volunteer at the museum.

Open Tuesday to Sunday 10:00 until 16:00 from April until October and at weekends throughout the winter. We welcome over 30,000 people a year.

We are looking for people who are friendly, outgoing and good communicators. In-house training will be given, and ongoing support is always available. We have two shifts each day to ensure the museum is open full days. Either mornings 9:30 to 13:00 or afternoons 13:00 to 16:30.
