



The museum runs almost entirely on volunteers, and we are always looking to recruit more people to join our team.

The main role for volunteers is to welcome our visitors. This involves taking payments, answering questions and selling items in the gift shop. There are always two people on duty.

Since Covid restrictions were introduced, one volunteer greets people. Around 50% of our visitors have pre-booked and paid on-line, so they are checked in on arrival. The remaining visitors are booked in if there is space to do so. Basic details are taken, name and email address.

The second volunteer takes payment for admissions and all shop sales. We have an electronic till and a card payment machine.

We currently encourage visitors to wear face masks and use hand sanitiser. There are acrylic screens in place at both reception desks.

There is a comprehensive 'Volunteers Handbook' that contains detailed information on everything necessary to work as a volunteer at the museum.

Open Tuesday to Sunday 10:00 until 16:00 from April until October and at weekends throughout the winter. We welcome over 30,000 people a year.

We are looking for people who are friendly, outgoing and good communicators. In-house training will be given, and ongoing support is always available. We have two shifts each day to ensure the museum is open full days. Either mornings 9:30 to 13:00 or afternoons 13:00 to 16:30.
