One Anne Barber married in 1669 and from the baptism dates above it seems more probable to be the younger of the two named above. One Anne is therefore discounted for lack of evidence. Since only one John is listed in the Hearth Tax Return it is assumed that the other was either dead or had left Eyam.</i>
